Each print is personally signed by pilots of Fighter Squadron 201 of the Mexican Expeditionary Air Force who flew and fought in the Philippines in 1945, including: General Angel Sanchez Rebollo, Coronel Carlos Garduno Nunez and Capitan Miguel Moreno Arreola. The result of five years of research, this is the only fine art edition depicting the Mexican Air Force in World War II and the only edition ever published in English and Spanish. They flew close support missions, assisting American and Filipino troops in the liberation of Luzon. The unit was decorated by the U.S., Mexico and the Philippines for valor.
